From the Institute Director



The acquisition of knowledge is a never-ending journey of discovery. Metropolitan Kallistos (Ware) tells of how he had a dream. A friend took him to his old school room, but also entered other unfamiliar rooms. "'How strange,' I said to my companion, 'that

I have lived here for all these years, and yet I never about the existence of all these rooms.' And he replied, 'But it is always so.'" Education is a place where we continue to discover new 'rooms' in the universe and the human heart. Acquiring knowledge has (or should have) a sense of wonder just like prayer and worship.

I was reminded of this at the recent SCMOI Information Night in Brisbane. Someone asked about how I came to the Orthodox Faith and I shared how my educational journey had been a key factor in the process. When I commenced graduate studies at The University of Melbourne, almost thirty years ago, my intention was to focus on Old Testament studies, but along the way I discovered the world of Syriac studies and I began to investigate all sorts of previously unimagined "rooms." In particular, as I began to work on various ancient Syriac writers, I found myself having to read the Church Fathers and to evaluate the version of Christianity that I had accepted until then against the fullness of the Fathers' understanding of the Gospel. This was my first step towards finding the Orthodox Church. When I started graduate education, little did I imagine that the experience I was embarking on would profoundly change my life and eventually lead to my becoming an Orthodox priest.

At SCMOI our mission is to help others on their educational journeys and to discover the wonders of knowledge. We want our students to be equipped with an in-depth understanding of the Orthodox Faith, knowing

and experiencing for themselves the marvels and transforming power of God's revealed truth. Studying the Faith requires discipline and commitment—just like any other field of study—but crucially, if it is to have real meaning, it requires building a relationship with God through prayer, worship and active obedience to Him.

For this reason, our courses have a strong practical focus on applying knowledge and learning skills that better enable us to actively live our faith and to share it with others. It is worth adding that many of these skills—problem solving, critical reflection, leadership, communication, advocacy, and pastoral care—are also highly transferable and valued in the workplace.

Whether at the undergraduate or postgraduate level the SCMOI goal, simply put, is to know, communicate, apply and live the Faith.

We are on an exciting journey and would love you to come and join us in discovering knowledge for faith and life.

After a delay to arrivals caused by heavy fog at Adelaide airport, we squeezed in a

session on ACD procedures with Dr Elizabeth Boase, Academic Dean at UCLT.

In the afternoon we were joined by ACD colleagues to hear our guest presenters. Professor Alistair McCulloch, Head of Research Education at the University of South Australia (UniSA) spoke on assessment and learning, challenging us to think about how we conduct student assessment and how better to use assessment as a formative tool for learning.
